INSURANCE GIANT DOMINATES STANDARD CHARTERED GREAT CITY RACE

Insurance giant, Legal & General dominated last night's Standard Chartered Great City Race, winning the men's, women's and mixed team events, while employee Phil Wicks captured the individual category in a blistering time of 14min 06secs.

Stephanie Robson of Steege Kingston maintained the strong showing for the insurance sector, winning the women's individual event in 18min 01secs. The 5km race attracted a record entry with some 400 City based teams taking part and helping raise money for Breakthrough Breast Cancer.

Kate Chapman, Kelly Smith and Alex Scott of the England Women's Football team warmed up for the World Cup in China later this year, by joining television presenter Beverley Turner in running for the Breakthrough team, which finished second in the women's category.

Such was Legal & General's dominance, that they filled the top three places in the Insurance category, while KPMG and Linklaters won the accountancy and legal team competitions respectively. The banking sector saw race sponsor Standard Chartered come out on top, while Running Fitness appropriately won the media team race.

The record field of 6,000 runners were set on their way by former 110m hurdle world record holder, Colin Jackson who commented, "*It was an amazing evening. To see so many people running through the City was quite an extraordinary sight. It was all done in a wonderful atmosphere and there was a real buzz about the whole night.*"

"The aim of the event was to bring people together as teams and to encourage them to get healthy and active, so to see 400 City companies getting together and running for such a wonderful cause as Breakthrough Breast Cancer was a great experience."

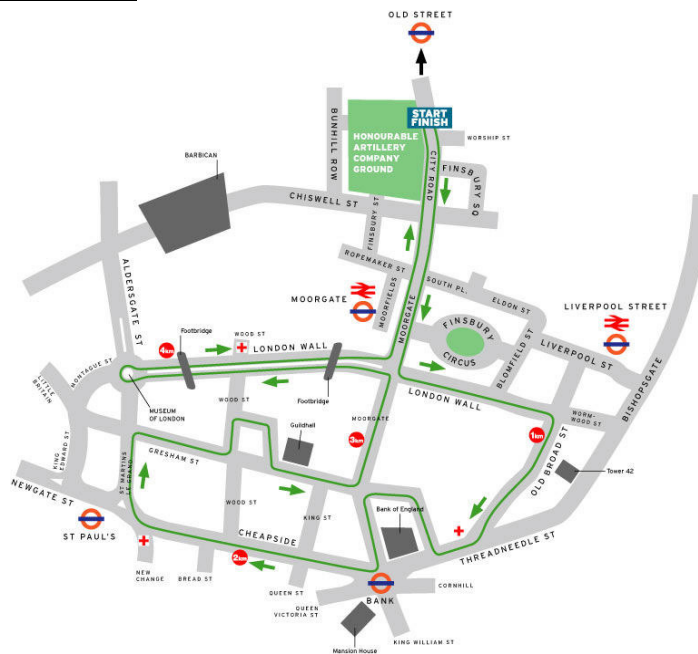
