STANDARD CHARTERED GREAT CITY RACE

On Thursday 14 July 2016 the Standard Chartered Great City Race (a 5km running race) will be passing your building. The race will start at 19:15 and will take in several City of London landmarks including Tower 42, the Bank of England and St Paul's Cathedral.

A number of roads in the city will be closed for a limited period. Road closures will be implemented between **18:30** until **20:30**. 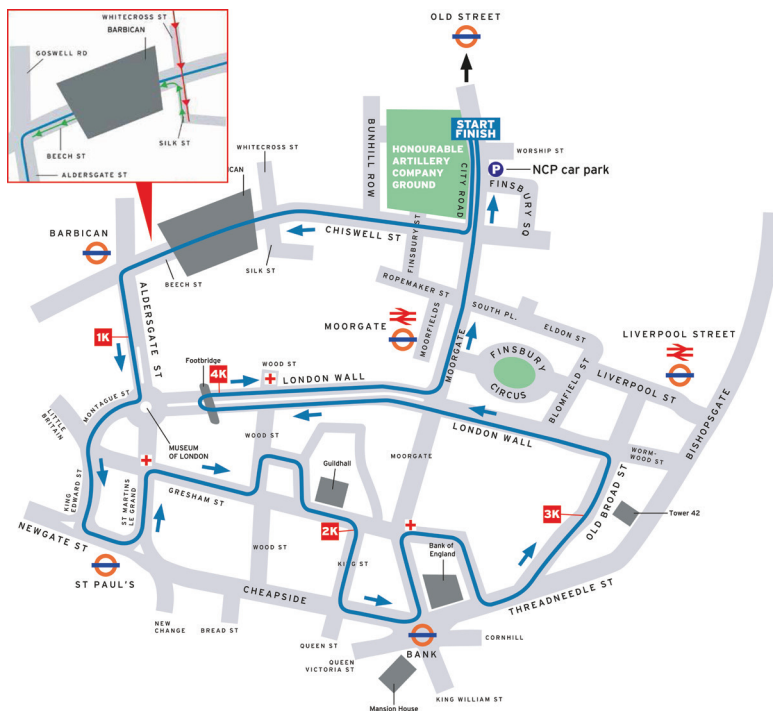

ROUTE City Road (Start), Finsbury Square, Finsbury Pavement, Chiswell Street, Beech Street, Aldersgate Street, Aldersgate Street roundabout (Museum of London), Montague Street, King Edward Street, Newgate Street, St Martins Le Grand, Gresham Street, Wood Street, Love Lane, Aldermanbury, Gresham Street, King Street, Cheapside, Prince's Street, Lothbury, Bartholomew Lane, Threadneedle Street, Old Broad Street, London Wall (westbound), London Wall (eastbound), Moorgate, Finsbury Pavement, Finsbury Square, City Road (Finish).

VEHICLE CROSSING POINT FOR RESIDENTS AND BARBICAN CENTRE (SEE MAP IN RED BOX ABOVE)

Road closures will be in place around the route from 18:30. Vehicles will be facilitated across the route at the identified crossing point (not to travel along the route):

- Access to Silk Street and Barbican Centre via Whitecross Street (southbound) until 19:15 (red route)
- Access away from Silk Street and Barbican Centre via Beech Street (westbound) until 19:15 (Green Route). The crossing point is anticipated to be closed for approximately 15 minutes and will then reopen after the last runner has passed.



Any surplus from the event will go to supporting recreational facilities in the City of London and Islington via the London Marathon Charitable Trust
